Most people carry their **ATM card** or credit card in a wallet or purse. These cards have a magnetic strip on them that carries information about your account and gives you access to automated teller machines. If you place a magnet near the cards, the data on the magnetic strip may be erased. As these cards are used for emergency cash, you don't want to be surprised by having the information disappear. If you find the card is not working, apply for a new one immediately.
